I am part of the Local Grants Committee at the Edina Rotary Club. This committee's job is to solicit, vet and approve grants to local nonprofits of \$5,000 or less. This past month, we completed our grant process and are giving just short of \$100,000 to nonprofits in the Twin Cities for unique projects.

As part of the committee, I vetted grants for five nonprofits including Cornerstone Advocacy (which provides services for victims of domestic abuse, human trafficking, and crime), Hope Academy (a Christian School in South Minneapolis which Calvary supports), and JCS Sober Living (a Sobriety Home for those recovering from alcoholism).

I have really enjoyed my involvement on this committee. I have gotten to know some amazing, servant-hearted Rotarians, become more familiar with some communitytransforming non-profits/schools in the Twin Cities, and empowered Kingdom work through the funds that we've been giving.

Pastor Eli and I are thankful that Calvary continues to encourage us and support us in our efforts to help Calvary be more outward focused. Through our involvement in Rotary, we continue to believe that Calvary is becoming a stronger presence for Christ here in Edina and throughout the Twin Cities.

MINISTRY UPDATE

Easter Baptisms

Baptism is a sign and seal of God's covenant of grace. The Heidelberg Catechism says, "God wants to teach us that the blood and Spirit of Christ take away our sins just as water removes dirt from the body." (QA 73) At Calvary, we usually baptize babies by sprinkling because they are born into Christian families where the Holy Spirit is active. The promise of the gospel is sure for them and the biological family and the church family are covenanting to raise the child to follow Jesus. This sign of the new covenant replaced circumcision as the sign of the old covenant.

The legitimacy of the baptism is not based on who does the baptism, what church the baptism is done, or what age the individual is baptized. The legitimacy is based in baptizing in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. That's why getting baptized once is enough. To get rebaptized basically says, "The promise from the triune God wasn't powerful enough the first time, so I want to do it again." We believe baptism in the Trinitarian name as Jesus teaches in the Great Commission is valid. That is why the Christian Reformed Church accepts baptisms done in other churches - Lutheran, Catholic, and others.

If the individual comes to faith in Christ as an adult and

has not been baptized yet, we will happily mark them with the sign and seal of God's covenant. That is why

we celebrated the baptisms of Zayna Oliver and Chris Petersen on Easter Sunday. Neither had been baptized yet and they believed the Spirit led them to Calvary and they wanted to profess their faith in Christ to our church and to the world. Adam was already baptized and that is why he shared his profession of faith.

So why did we dunk them? Why full immersion in water? Because the Bible tells us so. When John the Baptist was preparing the way for Jesus the Messiah, he called the people to be baptized in the Jordan River to show their repentance - turning away from sin and receiving God's forgiveness (Matthew 3). Ritual bathing was not a foreign concept for the Jewish people. If someone was unclean according to the law of Moses, after a specified time the individual would be dunked in a Jewish mikveh, which was basically a bathtub near or in a Jewish synagogue. The person would come out of the water cleansed, and would be able to participate in worship at the synagogue and rejoin the social life of the community.

We see other examples of full immersion baptism int he Acts of the Apostles. Philip baptized the Ethiopian in water after he understood the Isaiah 53 prophecy was about Jesus (Acts 8). Peter baptized the Roman centurion and his entire family (kids included) when they believed in the gospel about Jesus (Acts 10). The family baptism is significant for our Reformed tradition because we see adults and their children welcomed into the church. The adults were baptized and their children were baptized to show their initiation into God's family.

We will continue to praise God for the opportunities our church will have to baptize newborn babies into Christian families and adults who come to faith in Christ by the sanctifying work of the Spirit. Below are the faith stories of Adam, Zayna, and Chris when they were welcomed into our covenant community.

Adam and Zayna Oliver's Calvary story

Zayna was born in Liberia, Africa, and I was born in Anchorage, Alaska. We met about halfway between the two here in Minnesota. We are both students. I'm finishing up my law degree and she is working on a degree in criminal justice.

We started attending in August and have been so blessed with finding Calvary. We were looking for a Reformed Church and were drawn in by how welcoming everyone was. Our first Sunday we tried to escape after the service without socializing, but our efforts were thwarted by the many people that approached us and introduced themselves. In our short time here, we have already had some big moments. In November, we were married by Pastor Nick and Eli in this sanctuary, and now Zayna is getting baptized so this church will always have a special place in our heart.

What I'd say what really brought us here, was our desire to find a Christian community. We realized that the Bible only talks about Christians being with other Christians. The faithful are always a part of a faith community. Matthew 18:20 says, "When two or three of you are gathered, I am with you." That has been so true at Calvary.

Zayna's decision to get baptized

Since childhood I was raised in church and taught to always serve God because he was the creator of everything. As I grew older I always knew in the back of my mind I believed in God. The past couple of years I have been able to learn more about God. Through this learning and understanding I believe Jesus died for my sins, and I want to live righteously for my Savior who died to save me.

Where do you work?


Throughout the last year I have been working on completing training and certification to work as a birth doula. I have been working as a doula intern at the Minnesota Birth Center since September and will finish up my internship in May. I offer my services as a birth doula at a decreased cost for clients at the birth center, and in return, the birth center advertises their interns on their website and

the midwives really encourage all their clients to hire a doula. I am self employed throughout the internship, but have been able to work with many families throughout the last nine months.

What are your roles and responsibilities?

As a birth doula, I work to support my clients prenatally, throughout their labor and delivery, and in their early postpartum period. Typically, I see each of my clients and their partners for two prenatal

visits. Since many of my current clients are first time parents, we spend a lot of our prenatal visits talking about what to expect during labor and delivery and what different routines and procedures they can expect to encounter. A big part of doula work is providing clients with research and evidenced based information on different topics to help them make informed decisions for themselves during the birthing process. I often spend a lot of time discussing pros and cons of many different aspects of labor and delivery to help my clients feel informed and empowered to make decisions that they feel are best for them and their own situations. Our prenatal visits also extend into discussions about preparing bodies for labor and delivery prenatally, tools and techniques to help manage pain in labor, planning for postpartum, basic information and questions about lactation, etc. I aim to be a resource for my clients and also offer referrals to outside resources for any additional support they may need. I am on call for each client beginning at 38 weeks of pregnancy to work with them throughout their labor and delivery. Once my client is in labor, I join them when they feel they need extra support from someone in addition to their partner. During the labor process, my goal is to support my client mentally/emotionally and physically, I don't catch babies! I have vast knowledge of baby positioning and body positioning and how to use movement



to encourage the labor process. I'm also able to do a lot of problem solving and position work with my clients if there seems to be a stall in labor, a fetal positioning problem, or many other things you might expect to encounter during the labor and delivery process. I also meet with my clients once postpartum to debrief how they feel their birth went, check in on their well being, and see how they are adjusting to life with a new baby.

What are you currently working on that you are excited about?

Doula work and self-employment are all very new to me, so the whole process has been very exciting to learn. Everything from doula work itself to understanding how to run my own business and market myself. If I had to pick one specific thing I am most excited about, it would be implementing the Body Ready Method training that I completed in January, while working with my clients. The Body Ready Method is all about how birth workers (doulas, midwives, bodyworkers, physical therapists, etc.) can work with clients prenatally to optimize the body for childbirth. As a Body Ready Method certified pro, I have learned how to use movement and observation to assess a client's alignment, upper body, core, pelvis, and pelvic floor (we call these the five BRM pillars).

All of these areas are intricately connected to the core system and working on any tight or overstretched areas of these five pillars prenatally can increase balance and function within the body. The aim of all of this work is to "stack the cards" in your favor for a more comfortable pregnancy, a (hopefully) smoother labor and delivery, and easier postpartum recovery.

Since God is sovereign over every sphere, how do you see God at work in your work?

Watching babies being brought into the world is nothing short of a miracle, it is impossible to witness a birth and not be in awe of how God has intricately designed our bodies. Another aspect where I see God in doula work is when things inevitably don't go as planned. I can appreciate how God has created everyone with different talents and gifts so that the advances of modern medicine can be available to my clients and their babies when and if necessary. It is also my hope and my prayer that as I continue to work as a birth doula and learn how to best serve my clients, that God can work through me to be a blessing to others.

Are your co-workers Christians? Have you had opportunities to talk to them about what they believe? Have you been able to share your faith in Christ with them?

Since I am self employed, I don't have any "official" coworkers, but I get to know my clients intimately, and through my internship I have gotten to know a few of the midwives at MBC over the last few months. Many of my clients have been Christians and it has been really valuable to share this connection with them during their labor and delivery process, especially my clients through the internship, as all the births at MBC are natural without pain medication. It has been beautiful to see how some of my clients and their partners pull their faith into the birthing process through prayer, scripture, and/or song. I have had the privilege to pray with some clients, and knowing they are Christians allows me to support them in a different way emotionally as they work through labor. I am eager to see how I can continue to incorporate my faith and beliefs in my work with clients as I venture into more diverse work and as I work with a wider variety of providers and clientele.
