HONDURAS REFLECTIONS

This past February, I had the privilege of joining the team from Calvary on the journey to El Guanacaste, Honduras for the third time. The goal of this partnership in Honduras has been community development through sharing the good news of Jesus in word and deed. As always, it was a great trip with too many things to share! That said, there are some things about this trip that stick out.

First, I had the privilege of spending several hours with 15 Honduran pastors, many of them Christian Reformed. Both pastors from El Guanacaste were present.



I led a discussion on the ministry challenges and opportunities presented by the pandemic. It was fascinating to hear many of the same struggles, fears, and examples of God's provision and goodness that we experienced here in the states.

I also led a discussion with them on what they believe they need to help them flourish as pastors. While it was a blessing to hear their hunger and thirst for theological training and education, it was sobering to learn how limited their training has been. Some of the pastors admitted to not leading the sacraments on their own because they have not been trained how to do so. Given that spiritual transformation is a key

part of community transformation and development, I'm hopeful that we can find ways to nourish these hard-working pastors with the training they seek.

I was also pleasantly surprised at the level of trust, affection, and familiarity the people of El Guanacaste had with us. Since it had been three years since we visited last, I was concerned that we had lost some of the connection that we had developed with the community. By God's grace and the work of His Holy Spirit, it felt like we picked up right where we left off. Finally, the projects that World Renew and Diaconia Nacional are hoping to implement with our help are profoundly exciting. While there is much work to do related to the project, the ideas very much feel like the culmination of God's sovereignty in this partnership: our Reformed Worldview (our call being to renew and restore all things), our mission as a local church (to proclaim the good news of Jesus in Word and deed...), the relationships with World Renew and Diaconia that already existed because of the De Kam's ministry there, etc.



Like so many of you, I desperately want my Christian faith to matter. I want to be part of the building of God's Kingdom. I want to bring Him glory. I want to share the Good News of Jesus with people who don't know him. I want to help facilitate the transformation of lives and communities.

Our partnership in El Guanacaste is clearly one way that God is using Calvary to do all these things. May God continue to bless our partnership with El Guanacaste!





The Gospel and Basketball at Jefferson High School

Combining my desire to be more involved in my community and my love for basketball, I decided to coach girls basketball at Bloomington Jefferson High School the past two seasons. My hope was to help players with their game and be a light of Christ in the public schools.

We can't expect people outside the church to always come to worship services out of the blue. We are sometimes called to go out to where they are. Coaching is a great way to connect because of the time together through a season with the shared interest of sport.


I quickly learned some of the girls on the team were Christians so I asked them if they wanted to start a little FCA Bible study (Fellowship of Christian Athletes). They said there was an FCA at Jefferson but it was only once a month and not many high schoolers went. We decided to start another one specifically for the girls basketball players on a weekly basis.

I suggested studying women of faith from the Bible and they liked that idea. After practice on Thursdays, we sit on the bleachers (usually three to five players and me) and open the Bible. We have read the stories of Sarah, Rahab, Esther, the Samaritan woman, the Canaanite woman, Martha of Bethany, and Mary Magdalene. The girls have mixed faith backgrounds. Some grew up in church but stopped going after confirmation. Some have only gone to church camp and know little of the Bible, the gospel, or Jesus. Some faithfully attend their church. This has been a really cool opportunity because some are hearing the stories of Scripture for the first time.

When reading Esther, one player on the edge of her seat exclaimed, "Did she die!? What happened when she appeared before the king?!" When reading about Jesus and the Samaritan woman, one girl said, "Wow! Jesus was really nice to her. He wasn't racist or sexist at all!"

After discussing the stories of these incredible women of faith, we ask how it impacts us. We have talked about the meaning of faith, how being a committed Christian at school is uncommon, and how they see God working in them now and in the future. We always connect the story to Christ's life, death, and resurrection. To close, we pray together, usually I lead it but sometimes a player will volunteer. And by the way, I bring cookies to increase their energy. They are tired after practice!

This experience has affirmed for me the need for the gospel outside our Christian circles. Sometimes our culture supports the teachings of Jesus, and sometimes culture is in direct opposition to Jesus. Without someone to connect with, some people have no real grasp of the peace and purpose we receive in Christ. I hope and pray the Spirit continues to guide these teeangers and their families to follow Jesus.

I work for Metro Transit at the Nicollet Garage location.

As I go about my workday, I'm reminded of Philippians 2:4, where we learn about unity through humility, looking out for the interests of others, not only our own. Also, in Matthew 5:16 Jesus tells us to let our light shine before men.

I'm blessed to have layover time between bus trips, some longer than others, which is one of my favorite times of the day because I'm able to use that personal time to focus on the Bible, read books on theology and take notes from lectures dealing mainly with presuppositional apologetics, a passion of mine.

Are your co-workers Christians? Have you had opportunities to talk to them about what they believe? Have you been able to share your faith in Christ with them?

While I'm blessed to work with other Christians, some that I work with are not, and while I've had opportunities to talk with them about what they believe and have been able to share my faith in Christ with them, thus far it's been somewhat limited, mainly leading by example. However, my prayer Lord willing is that my time spent learning about non-Christian worldviews over the past few years will prepare me to become a more effective witness for Christ as I politely engage my colleagues more fully going forward.

Council Update

Commons Renovation

BDH, the Architectural firm designing the Commons Renovation, will deliver the final design drawings about the time you read this article. Once the design is complete, we will transition from the Design Phase of the project to the Construction/Execution phase. Craig Veurink and the Commons Renovation Team have done a great job developing the vision, concept, and design phases of the project. They guided Calvary to engage BDH, a very good selection as an Architectural firm, and they spent many hours working with BDH to complete the design.

Now that we're transitioning to the construction phase, we need different leadership skills for the Steve Abbring, who has a degree in construction management and a lot of experience in that area, has agreed to be Calvary's Project Manager as we go into the construction phase. The Commons Renovation Team will remain involved in furniture selection, signage and lettering definition, and in other ways. It is possible we may need to make a few minor design changes as we get into the construction and we will lean on the Commons Renovation Team to help with that. What I'm trying to say is, by the power vested in me, I hearby bestow the title of Senior Executive Project Consultants on all the Commons Renovation Team members. Leadership of the project will transition to Steve and we assure you, Steve is going to do an

excellent job (no pressure Steve.)

We have three contractors lined up to bid the project. We will conduct a thorough bid review and then engage with the best contractor. We plan to kick-off construction on June 12 and current projections indicate we should be complete by mid to late September.

Annual Congregational Meeting Planning

The Council has started our preparations for the annual Congregational Meeting which will occur in May. The Nominations Committee is engaged and working the process that will lead to the nominees of Deacon and Elder that we will present to the congregation. We are also developing the budget for the coming fiscal year and will present that for approval.

F2023 Ministry Fund

In our last report we indicated Ministry Fund giving was 10% below budget. Thank you for responding to that and increasing your giving! As of the end of January, you have given \$434k to the Ministry Fund compared to a YTD budget of \$440k which means we are essentially on track. Thanks! Please continue your faithful financial support of Calvary. We need to collect another \$226k by the end of May to meet our budget and to continue fully funding all of Calvary's ministries and the ministries we support.

Other Updates

The Council is very thankful that Pastor Nick and the Honduras Team were able to visit our partner village, El Guanacaste, Honduras again this year after two years of no visits. The visit was very positive and impactful for our team and for El Guanacaste. Please plan to join us for lunch on March 5, after the worship service, when the Calvary team will tell us about their visit, and provide details about a very exciting potential opportunity for Calvary to partner with El Guanacaste on an upcoming agricultural project. Lunch will be provided.

Pastor Eli and the Youth Ministry Team announced Calvary's youth will go on a Serve trip to Thunder Bay on July 8 - 15. We will host 60 to 70 kids at Twin Cities Serve on July 29 - August 5. VBS is scheduled for June 12 - 16.

Calvary will host Classis Lake Superior meetings on March 6 and 7. Pastor Nick, Elder Karen De Kam, and Deacon Rosanne Van Marion are Calvary's delegates to the meeting.
